## Exploring Your Spirituality

One of the way I can offer to you as an aid in discovering your own gifts of the Spirit during this Trinity season is through helping you explore your own spirituality through personality inventories. During these weeks after Trinity Sunday, which continue through the fall, I will be happy to meet with any of you who wish to discover your spiritual roots, and the best way for you to develop your spirituality in accordance with your personality type.

The most popular way is to use the Myers-Briggs Type Inventory, which enables us to see ourselves as persons who have preferences for the ways in which we perceive reality and make decisions. Its goal is to help people achieve the kind of integration that leads to spiritual wholeness. One of the applications is to discover which of your paths of spiritual growth is most appropriate for your personality. Each of the gospels is written from the perspective of a different type. Matthew was a sensing-thinking type; Mark was a sensing-feeling type; Luke was an intuitive-feeling type; and John was an intuitive-thinking type. It helps us to understand why one gospel appeals to us more than another. Another application is to discern how we learn best, so that we can relate to others in a learning situation. Still other applications help you discern your leadership or management style, or your writing style, or even your vacationing style, so you can choose how and where to spend your vacation most advantageously for yourself and your family. Let me know if you would like to pursue this opportunity. I am in the office every Tuesday and Thursday from 11 AM to 1 PM, and on Sunday morning after the worship service.

Or, you can call me at my home office and I'll get back to you at your convenience.

The Enneagram is another way to gain knowledge about yourself and the various ways people view life. Realizing the differing ways individuals perceive, process and respond to their environment not only helps toward self-knowledge, but to understand ourselves in the context of human relationships. To study the Enneagram and to observe the reality of what it describes is to become a more sensitive instrument through whom the Spirit can flow for yourself and others. As we take and study the Enneagram, we gradually come to see how we frustrate what we most desire for ourselves. We become aware of what clouds our perceptions and blocks our energy. We learn what strikes fear into our heart and paralyzes them as well as what sends them into automatic, compulsive reaction. We come to know the patterns of personal dynamics and life themes as these recur in experience. Through those awarenesses, we can become reconciled with who we are and learn to flow with our life energies. We discover what gift of ours is a gift for others as well as for us. Over time, we become better friends to ourselves, discovering where we had made ourselves our own enemy. As more inclusive, more honest, more contemplative awareness of inner and outer reality expands, we grow in consciousness of our gifts, that experience which makes us human. That is what makes the season of Trinity so important. I hope you will use on of these opportunities during the summer.

### Fathers Day is Blanket Sunday and Tools of Hope Sunday

On Fathers Day, June 19, New Hempstead Presbyterian Church will collect money for Church World Service to support their Tools of Hope and Blanket programs. A gift of just \$5 can make a difference to people in developing countries and show them someone cares.

Every \$5 you give to Church World Service can provide a good wool or cotton blend blanket because they buy in large quantities. When possible, CWS purchases blankets close to the scene of a disaster, to speed delivery and to spur local economies.



In the Tools of Hope program, a gift of five dollars can purchase one of:

- Enough potato seeds to grow more than 6700 pounds of potatoes
- 4 Moringa tree seedlings
- One rabbit or some baby chicks
- 50 fish fingerlings

Church World Service has been providing comfort and assistance to those in need for more than 50 years. Working with partner agencies on the scene around the world, CWS is able to respond quickly.




### Session Highlights



## Presbyterian Scholars Program

You can make the difference in one young person's life.

Westminster College (PA) has chosen to embrace its Presbyterian heritage by offering 150 Young Presbyterian Scholarships (YPS) worth \$11,000 per year for four years. This scholarship is available for students who are PC(USA) members and hold a 3.5 cumulative high school grade point average. The YPS scholarship is intended for graduating high school seniors who will join us for four years.

Each congregation is able to nominate one student per year.

Unlike other scholarships, the college has chosen to create a Program for these students which encourages their involvement in the PC(USA) and offers them opportunities for personal and spiritual growth, domestic and international mission experiences and peer ministry on campus.



The inaugural group of YPS students is from eleven different states and diverse churches and communities. Their bond is through Christ, and they have made an immediate impact on our campus through academic excellence, service and leadership.

Nomination forms will be mailed this summer or you can nominate on-line beginning in July.

## Synod to Take New Shape and Role

Determining the emerging shape and role of the Synod of the Northeast was the major task accomplished by commissioners to the April 22–24 Synod of the Northeast Assembly. The commissioners perfected and then approved a plan that had been presented by the Ad Hoc Committee on a Mission Design Plan

To be implemented in 2006, the plan adopted will encourage formation of presbytery partnership groups to carry out mission as appropriate in each of their environments. Monies saved by reducing to six the number of synod staff working in the present synod office will be distributed among partnership groups to fund the ministries needed there. (Currently the synod office has 10 full-time staff, one halftime staff, and a consultant.) Under the new structure, the Synod Assembly will meet annually and a Synod Council will conduct necessary synod business between annual meetings. Geographically proximate presbytery groups also will meet, with Synod commissioners from each of their presbyteries participating in those gatherings.

The Synod of the Northeast includes 235,013 Presbyterians worshipping in 1186 chartered congregations and 39 fellowships or developing congregations.
