

For some, Easter is all about God's victory over death. It was for me when I was a child. My beliefs went something like this: Before Jesus, when we died there was nothing. Now because of Jesus, when we die we have eternal life. I still believe this to be true, but for me, at least now in my life, it does not matter as much. It once comforted me but now I find it too limiting. Is this really all there was to Jesus?

Over the years, I have come to believe that it is Jesus' life that matters as much as his death and resurrection. Now, I believe that as Christians, it is our call to live THIS life here on earth following the way of Christ. If resurrection means anything it means that the life of radical love, Jesus embodied; the vision for humanity he lived and died for, remains alive and well and we, 2000 years later, can choose to be a part of Resurrection Living. We can be Resurrection People.

Resurrection People, who live **this** life to the fullest recognizing that it is a precious gift. It does not mean we wait around for the time after death when our "real" life begins. We are called to make heaven a reality here on earth: loving as Jesus loves us, embodying mercy and forgiveness, caring for the least among us and advocating for systemic change in a world that keeps some people in the margins. The Manse

If you attended the Annual Meeting on February 11 then you heard about our plans to rejuvenate the manse for the new minister. Other than fixing thinks that broke, little was done to the manse during Lori and Howard's eighteen years there to refresh it. Now is our opportunity to do so.

Session has approved a program that includes updating the electrical system, replacing the appliances, replacing the kitchen cabinet doors, repairing a chimney leak, replacing the furnace, replacing the laundry room floor, remodeling the master bathroom, painting the entire interior, and assorted other projects. Session has also approved funds to pay for the work, but not enough for us to pay outsiders to do all of the work. Some will need to be done by us.

We've already started on some of the work. We've pulled up the old laundry room floor, laid

a sub-floor, and are in the process of laying a new laminate waterproof floor. The kitchen cabinets have been scrubbed clean inside, in preparation for new cabinet doors.

The kitchen and laundry room walls have been scrubbed clean in preparation for new paint. Wall spackling is underway. Exclusive electrical circuits for the microwave and the refrigerator are being installed. All of the work so far has been done by us, volunteering our time. Many thanks to Pam, Kyle, Chris, Bill, Susan, Angela, Ed, Nancy, Barbara and Mark for their free labor.

The project is being managed by the Buildings and Grounds Committee; thanks to Kyle, Chris, Fred, Kristen, Pam, and Mark for their leadership.

There will be more projects in the days ahead. The current schedule is for volunteers each Saturday plus some days during the week. Someone will be working in there most days for the foreseeable future. When we are in need of volunteers, we will make an announcement in church. If you would like to volunteer for something in particular, please let a committee member know. There is always something to do.



We will be providing an update in each Carriage Stone until the project is complete.
