

Spring Time means clean up time and not just our own yards. NHPC is once again hosting a spring cleanup of New Hempstead Road. We will be picking up roadside trash on New Hempstead Road, from Route 45 east to the entrance to the Palisades Parkway, plus Old Schoolhouse Road where it crosses next to the church. I certainly enjoyed the "Poor Man's Cake" from the coffee hour on March 17. If you did too, here is the recipe from Gramma Eva Balcam.

1	Cup	Coffee (liquid)
1/2	Cup	Shortening
1	Large Handful	Raisins
1	Cup	Brown sugar (packed)
1	Tsp	Cinnamon
1/2	Tsp	Cloves
1	Cup	Flour
1/2	Tsp	Baking Soda
1	Tsp	Baking Powder
1/2	Tsp	Salt

Grease 9" (or 8") square pan and heat oven to 350°.

Bring coffee, shortening, raisins and brown sugar to a boil in a saucepan and then cool.

Add in remaining ingredients, stirring just enough to combine.

Move mixture to greased pan and bake for 45 minutes.
