The renovation of the manse is now complete. To recap, building was scrubbed clean. The kitchen, laundry room, and upstairs bathroom were gutted. The kitchen got new appliances, cabinet doors, counter tops, and backsplash. The laundry room got a new floor, washer, dryer, and utility sink. The upstairs bathroom got all new tile, toilet, and sink. All of the walls and ceilings on the first and second floors received a fresh coat of paint. The bedrooms got new light fixtures.
